




Mayor's Message

The Fanwood Downtown revitalization and improvement efforts and plans are moving forward. We expect to award a contract for summer construction of the downtown streetscaping for Martine and South Avenues. A contract will also be awarded for parking lot improvements behind the stores on the west side of Martine Avenue. The most exciting recent development is the selection of our new

downtown street lamp called "The Fanwood" by the manufacturer. This Victorian street lamp will have a Bishop's crook and scroll design duplicating the lamps that were at the train station 70-100 years ago. They will be truly unique. The Downtown Revitalization Committee (DRC) is working with PSE&G on implementing this phase of the downtown improvements. Funding for the downtown improvement effort came from 1999 grants of \$300,000 from Union County and \$100,000 from the State of New Jersey. The DRC continues to investigate all possible options for retaining and attracting businesses. We will soon be hiring an individual to perform market analyses. This will also be funded by the above grants. We have received several informal inquiries from outside firms and businesses that would like to become involved in Fanwood's downtown future. We are in final negotiations with NJ Transit (NJT) for a contract covering the new and expanded South Avenue train station parking lot. NJT has purchased the former Scotchwood Automotive property which will be added to the existing parking lot. This will result in more than fifty additional parking spaces in the new combined and re-landscaped lots. This work will also be done this summer. Please remember to support the annual fund drives by the Fanwood Rescue Squad and the Fanwood Volunteer Fire Department. Also, please consider becoming a volunteer for one of these truly vital

organizations. And finally, be sure to mark your calendar for the Annual Fanny Wood Day event which is scheduled for Sunday, September 24.

The Westfield Regional Health Department reports that the State of New Jersey recently unveiled a strategy for dealing with a possible return of the West Nile Virus (WNV) this spring.

New Jersey's plan includes enhanced mosquito control efforts; increased human, animal and mosquito surveillance; a streamlined system for testing collected samples; and a public education program.

The plan involves the coordinated efforts of a number of federal, state and local agencies including the New Jersey Departments of Health and Senior Services, Environmental Protection and Agriculture, the federal Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), the State Mosquito Control Commission, the Rutgers Mosquito Research and Control Unit, and focal health and mosquito control agencies.

The New Jersey Department of Health and Senior Services will serve as the central coordinating agency for WNV surveillance and reporting. The department will take the lead in communicating with public health and mosquito control officials and will develop and distribute educational materials. The department will post fact sheets and up-to-date information for the public on its Web site at www.state ni.us/ health. • When outdoors, wear for such as, shoes, socks, longwith recommended insect Residents are also being repellents (follow instructions!)

• Curb outside activity at heavy underbrush.

• Repair holes in screens on doors and windows.

• Fill ornamental pools with mosquito-eating fish.

• Drain flat roofs that pool water on a regular basis.

• Fill holes in trees and stumps with suitable material.

NOTE: Rain gutters need to be physically inspected to see if debris is being collected that would restrict water flow and create a mosquito breeding source. Recent news articles reported that all positive cases cited last year revealed mosquito-breeding areas on the properties of the affected parties.

Ms. Vollero explained that hen chickens have been used to successfully test for the West Nile-Like Virus for 15 years. Even when infected with the virus, the chickens do not become sick. Union County's three, 21-week old chickens have been stationed in the backyard of the mosquito bureau's offices behind the county Engineering Department on South Avenue in Scotch Plains. The chickens reside in a rabbit hutch-like cage the size of a refrigerator.

An Important Summer Message From the Fanwood PD

The Fanwood police department would like to ensure the safety of all residents. The following tips are recommended for use by residents while away on vacation.

Please make sure:

• All doors and windows in your home are locked.

• If the home is empty for a period of time, give the appearance that someone is home.

• Leave lights on timers, a radio playing, and a car in the driveway if possible.

• Be sure to have a friend or neighbor collect morning newspapers and mail.

The lawn should also be cut while away. These are all

signs of an occupied house. Residents can also request a periodic vacation check on their house by the Fanwood Police Department. Your house will be visually checked on a random basis as circumstances permit during extra motorized patrol.

Stop in Police Headquarters and fill out a request with important information to be kept on file during your vacation.

Also advise neighbors that you will be away and have them watch for anything suspicious.

If they notice anything unusual have them call the Fanwood Police immediately by dialing 911 or (908) 322-5000.
