



Historic Preservation Commission Celebrates 20th Anniversary!



The Historic Preservation Commission is celebrating its 20th anniversary in 2009. It was established to preserve and protect Fanwood's historic resources. The commission's most important achievement was the 2004 designation of the Fanwood Park Historic District, which is listed on the New Jersey and National Register of Historic Places. It played an integral part in featuring some of Fanwood's historic homes through a presentation on Channel 35 and a walking tour. In May 2007, the

Museum of Fanwood in the town's iconic Victorian train station was opened. The museum enabled the commission to consolidate a valuable collection of artifacts and archives that can be used by appointment, by authors, historians, and curious citizens. It is open from 2:00 - 4:00 PM on the first Sunday of each month. Commission members are appointed by the Mayor for 3-year terms; presently there are openings. They meet at the museum at 7:15 PM on the second Monday of each month, except for July, August, and December.



A Message From Mayor Colleen Mahr

Greetings from Borough Hall! I trust we all are ready to say goodbye to winter and welcome the first signs of spring. As the municipal council and I settle into 2009 there are several updates I want to share with you.

First, in order to expand our cultural offerings while drawing attention to the renovated Kuran Cultural Arts Center on Watson Road, I am thrilled to announce a new performance series set to kick off this spring. People often think they need to travel to New York City to see quality musical performances, but there is a vibrant arts community right here in our own backyard. Supported by the Fanwood Arts Council, this series will allow you to experience great music in an historic setting within walking distance of your home. Another challenging budget process is upon us and I want to thank those who responded to my call to serve on the Citizens Budget Advisory Committee. These Fanwoodians will work with the council to navigate the challenges Fanwood faces in balancing the soaring costs of pension obligations, healthcare and utilities as revenues continue to decline. As in the past, I am confident that we can make the tough but necessary decisions to keep our 20 percent of the property tax bill in line. We all are suffering; some of our neighbors worse than others. The council and I understand that.

During this economic crisis I want you to know that there is help available on the local, county or state level, for any resident who may be struggling and feels they have no place to turn. Our Fanwood Handyman program for example, targets qualifying senior citizens with minor home repairs that may otherwise not get done. I strongly encourage any senior who would like more information to contact Borough Hall at (908) 322-8236

Finally, there was a recent incident of racist literature being distributed in town and I want to acknowledge the concern expressed by many about this type of intolerable message. I will never sit silently on the

Sign up for Emergency Notification!

Union County residents can now register their cell phone and e-mail accounts on a new notification system that will send out alerts in the event of a local emergency. The system already has the records of all land-line residential phone numbers in the county, but you must add cell phone, e-mail and pager information if you want additional notification. Meet Councilman Russell Huegel

Russell Huegel was born in New York, but is a life-long New Jersey resident raised in Teaneck, New Jersey. He attended Richard Stockton College of New Jersey where he received a degree in political science. Register Your Alarm System in 2009!

Homeowners must register their existing home alarm systems with the Borough. Forms will be available on the Borough website at visitFanwood.com. New systems must be registered within 30 days of installation. In an effort to educate the public and reduce false alarm calls to the Police Department homeowners whose alarm systems are mistakenly triggered, will first receive a warning and explanation of the regulations. After the third false alarm in a year, a fine will be imposed.

Fanwood Arts Council and Carriage House Poetry Series

The Fanwood Arts Council celebrated the Carriage House Poetry Series' tenth anniversary in December 2008 with a jazz concert. The concert featured Denise DeLeo (who has performed at Lincoln Center and Carnegie Hall) Hui Cox on guitar and Andy Eulau on bass. There was also a book launch for The Carriage House Poetry Series Tenth Anniversary Anthology.

The poetry series, a satellite project of the Fanwood Arts Council, was established by Adele Kenny in December, 1998 and funded by the New Jersey State Council on the Arts, through a grant administered by the Union County Division of Cultural and Heritage Affairs. The Poetry Series led to the establishment of the Fanwood Arts Council in March of 1999. To date, the Arts Council has presented nearly 100 events: dance, vocal and instrumental performances, art shows, multi-cultural festivals, poetry readings, National Poetry Month and Black History Month observances, summer "bandstands," and Fanny Wood Day concerts. 
Freeholder HEART grants, Merck & Co., the Fanwood Recycling Association, the SPF Service League, and local merchants.

New N-1-1 Dialing Codes

Hopefully everyone knows to dial 9-1-1 in the event of a life-threatening emergency, and you may be familiar with some other N-1-1 codes or numbers (said as "N-one-one") like 3-1-1 used in NYC for non-emergency governmental services. There are some new dialing codes we thought you should become familiar with, so here's the complete list:

- **2-1-1** connects you to the United Way to learn about health and human service organizations in Union County, and other United Ways when dialed from other locations.
- **3-1-1** is reserved for non-emergency municipal government services. This number is not used in Fanwood, but may be available in other parts of the country.
- **4-1-1** connects you to directory assistance from your telephone carrier. Calls to this number may incur a charge. You can also try web search engines or free directory assistance numbers (like 800-FREE411) to get the number you want.
- **5-1-1** is used for traffic information or police non-emergency services, also somewhat dependent on where you are located.
- **6-1-1** is for your telephone company's customer service and repair.
- **7-1-1** is for the Telecommunication Relay Service for deaf people to communicate via devices, through an operator, to hearing people and vice versa.
- **8-1-1** is the new "Call before you dig" number to identify underground public utilities around your home or business. You or your contractors are required by law to call this number at least three business days before digging.
- **9-1-1** continues to be the number for emergency services such as police, fire and rescue squad services. Remember to only use 9-1-1 if a life may be at risk.



Learn to Ride a Bike Without Training Wheels!

On Sunday, May 17, the Fanwood Recreation Commission, in conjunction with Bike New York, will sponsor the 1st Annual Training Wheel Toss from 1–4 PM at the Union County Vocational School parking lot in Scotch Plains. This program is designed to teach children a safe, easy, and effective way to learn to ride their bicycles. Using the “balance first” method introduced by Bike New York, the non-profit organization dedicated to cycling advocacy, participants learn the basics of balancing, starting, stopping, and steering a bike. By the time the class is over, most children will have already learned to ride their bike independently! However, even if they don’t, children (and parents) will leave with


an easy and fun way to learn to ride.

All participants must wear a helmet and have a bicycle that is in good working condition. Also, all cyclists must be able to rest their feet flat on the ground while sitting on his or her bicycle seat. All participants must be at least 5-years old and be accompanied by an adult throughout the entire session. Parents or guardians are encouraged to remove training wheels prior to the class, if possible. Participation is free, but pre-registration, limited to the first 50, will be required. Neighbors Helping Neighbors

The Scotch Plains/Fanwood Social Service Food Pantry is a lifeline for one Scotch Plains couple who have a special needs son and no family close by. Prior to finding out about the pantry, the boy's mother said, "We would make sure our son was fed, but skip meals ourselves. Besides the food, the kindness of the people here makes it like a family."

Coordinated by Marie Davis, the pantry is located in the Scotch Plains Municipal Building at 430 Park Avenue. With the recession, the number of people needing assistance continues to grow. The pantry is grateful for the donations it receives from local civic and religious organizations, but those amounts vary. Additional

donations of food and other new, unopened items are also greatly needed.

Items can be dropped off at the Scotch Plains Municipal Building or the Fanwood Municipal Building weekdays from 9 to 4 PM. Donations are also

an invaluable service to the pantry. Frozen items are only accepted at the Scotch Plains-Municipal Building.

The pantry dispenses food to Fanwood and Scotch Plains residents every Tuesday morning from 9 to 11 AM, two bags per family. On those days, Margo assists Marie with giving out the food. Having been through tough times herself, Margo is happy to give back. "When people are busy going to work and handling their

own hectic lives, they sometimes have blinders on. They don't see the need. I see the need every week." Both Marie and Margo donate countless hours of their own time to help keep the pantry running.

Shade Tree Commission

The purpose of this commission is to maintain the Fanwood Community Forest, which includes all street trees and trees on borough property such as LaGrande and Forest Road Parks. It arranges for the planting of new trees as well as educating the community about the importance of trees through its annual Arbor Day program. The Shade Tree Commission has earned the honor of Tree City USA from the National Arbor Day Foundation for 15 consecutive years. The group holds open public meetings on the fourth Wednesday of each month at the Community House (train station) at 7:30 PM. The commission currently has seven members appointed by the Mayor. One seat is currently vacant.



Fanwood Environmental Commission Says, Thanks!

Thanks to the many Girl Scout volunteers who handled stations at the Third Annual Fanwood Bird Count Workshops held on February 7th at the Fanwood Nature Center. Their generosity enabled the Commission to promote the "Great Backyard Bird Count" (www.birdsource.org/gbbc) held on February 13-16.



GBBC participants made history, breaking records for the number of birds reported and the number of checklists submitted. This event helps to build a long-term record of where people are finding birds and how many birds there are.

The Fanwood Nature Center is spread over eight acres of preserved land, just off Terrill Road (turn on Cray Terrace and park on the street.)

Last year a Monarch way station (Butterfly Garden) was added which will be in full bloom soon. Pick up a Nature Center Guide, available at the libraries and Borough Hall or on the Fanwood Environmental Commission website at www.fanwoodec.org.

Important Notice For Seniors Regarding Property Tax Freeze

The State of New Jersey recently signed legislation changing qualifying income limits for Senior and Disabled residents who wish to participate in the Property Tax Freeze (AKA Property Tax Reimbursement) Program. New legislation has increased the income limit to \$60,000 regardless of marital status. The Division of Taxation has stated that applications will be mailed to residents who may qualify under the new income limit as well as those who have qualified in previous years.

In addition, first time applicants can get the booklets from our Tax Collector, Colleen Huehn, some time in March. After the paperwork is filled out and after Colleen Huehn has signed the application, it must be sent to the state for processing no later than March 31, 2009.

If you were unable to take advantage of the tax freeze due to delinquent tax status, please contact Colleen at 908-322-8236 as there is a change in this legislation that may allow you to apply.
