Steady Demand at Food Pantry

The downturn in the economy has caused an increase in the number of individuals and families turning to the Scotch Plains/Fanwood Social Service Food Pantry. For some the need is ongoing, while for others the pantry serves a temporary need while someone is looking for a job or changing residences.

While the pantry usually has a ready stock of canned goods available, other items that are often in short supply include boxed potatoes, rice, canned meats, frozen meals, juice, paper products and toiletries such as soap, toothbrushes and toothpaste.

Monetary donations are also accepted in order to provide help to families with particular needs.

A Message From Mayor Colleen Mahr

As I write this, snowdrifts are mounting outside my window. I sincerely hope this newsletter finds you enjoying the onset of an early spring! Mother Nature tested us with over three feet of snow since January, and the Department of Public Works passed with flying colors. But many of us despair to see snowplows on our street, knowing the driveway may be

blocked again. Clint Dickson, Director of the Department of Public Works shared a few tips that may help next year.

- Don't shovel the last ten feet of your driveway until most of the plowing is done. That way, your driveway won't provide a gap for the plowed snow.
- When shoveling the driveway opening, shovel to the right of the driveway opening so the plow doesn't push that same snow back into your driveway.

On January 1st we welcomed Mike Szuch and Robert Manduca to the Council and got right to work. In addition to meeting with our many boards and commissions, we began preliminary budget discussions. I am hopeful that the tough decisions we made in the past will help us absorb the fiscal hits heading our way. Governor Christie has made it very clear that municipalities should expect a reduction of aid this year. We will know exactly how deep the cuts will be when he gives his state budget address. While I understand that we all must share in the pain and in the reductions, I do not want to see all the problems pushed down for local government to absorb. In order to help Fanwood weather this budget season I am pressing for action on proposed reforms to the state pension system and the system of negotiating contracts with public employee unions. Any tools to help reduce our expenses are tools worth having. I will be hard at work on containing the 20% of our overall property tax bill that represents Fanwood's municipal spending.

With savings in mind, the Administration & Finance Committee led by Councilman Parenti worked to establish the new position of Purchasing Agent. The state will soon mandate all municipalities to have a Qualified Purchasing Agent on staff. We believe it will be a cost-saver for Fanwood. Fortunately we have a current staffer trained for the work, so there is no added cost to the Borough. We've already seen thousands of dollars in savings and expect that trend to continue over the next two years as we fully implement a program for centralized purchasing.

But on to Spring! In Fanwood that means heading outdoors and enjoying the parks. The Recreation Commission continues to provide a variety of fun programs for kids. You'll find the spring and summer schedules inside on Page 4. A listing of the continuing senior recreation program is posted as well. You can start making summer vacation plans! You should also post April 10 on your calendar as the kick off for the second year of the Carriage House Performance Series. Go to fanwoodperformanceseries.org to reserve a seat! I want to thank everyone who helped to organize the County of Union Box Lunch Program this winter. With the seniors handling most of the operations,

Census 2010



April 1, 2010 is Census Day! That is the day that every resident, native or immigrant, legal or illegal, should stand up and be counted. Census forms were

delivered to every household in March, and by April 1 the form should be completed and promptly mailed. The Census has many uses: among them the allocation of federal and state funding to schools and municipalities, and the determining the number of elected representatives seated in Congress.

For full information about the Census go to www.census.gov/2010census. Individuals who do not return their forms may expect to have a personal visit from a census worker in order to complete the count. Let's ensure that Fanwood has a 100% response rate. Please return your form promptly on April 1!

Find Fanwood News On Your TV Dial

Fanwood's Municipal Access TV station can be seen on both the Verizon (FIOS) system as well as on the Comcast system, (Channel 35.) If you own one of the newer upscale TV



sets, you may not be getting the sound on Channel 35. Unlike the major TV channels, Comcast does not send out its local access audio signal on stereo. If your set is programmed to watch mostly stereo programming, you have to use your remote control to go into the "menu" and find the audio settings. Then switch the setting from "stereo" to "mono."

Verizon subscribers see Fanwood programming on Channel 24 and they do not have this problem.

During daytime hours, both channels show a local Community Bulletin Board. After 7 PM, a variety of locally produced shows are telecast.

...and only 417 dogs? That's how many pets have been licensed through the Borough, as of the 2010 deadline of January 31st. If you have cats and/or dogs in Fanwood, you must get them rabies shots and have them licensed. Rabies shots help protect everyone in our community. Fanwood offers a free

rabies clinic at the DPW lot in May each year. This year the date is May 18, from 5:30 PM to 6:30 PM. The license fees go towards the cost of our animal control service – the folks who pick up deceased animals on the roadways and take care of stray animals when they are found. The more people who properly register their pets, the lower the cost of these services to all the residents.

Learn to Ride a Bike!

Is your child having trouble learning to ride a two-wheeler? Is your child afraid to get on a two-wheeler for fear of falling down? Is your back sore from bending down and running beside your child as he or she learns to ride a bike without training wheels? If so, this is the program for you!



On Sunday, May 16, 2010, the Fanwood Recreation Commission will sponsor the 2nd Annual Training Wheel Toss from 1 PM to 4 PM at the Union County Vocational School parking lot on Raritan Road in Scotch Plains. This program teaches children a safe, easy and effective way to ride their bicycles. Using the "balance first" method introduced by Bike New York, the non-profit organization dedicated to cycling advocacy, participants learn the basics of balancing, starting, stopping and steering a bike. By the time the class is over, most children will know how to ride their bikes independently! However, even if they don't, children (and parents) will leave with an easy and fun way to learn to ride.

All participants must be at least 5-years old, wear a helmet and have a bicycle that is in good working condition, and must be able to rest their feet flat on the ground while sitting on his or her bicycle seat. All participants must be accompanied by an adult throughout the entire session.

Fanwood Observes Earth Hour!

SENIOR SIDELIGHTS...

Property Tax Reimbursement (Senior Freeze) Eligibility Requirements



You must meet **all** of the following requirements to qualify:

- Age 65 or older as of December 31, 2008, or if under age 65, you were receiving Federal Social Security disability benefits as of December 31, 2008 and December 31, 2009

And

- You have lived in New Jersey continuously since before January 1, 1999 as either a homeowner or renter

And

- You have owned and lived in your home (or have leased a site in a mobile home park for a manufactured or mobile home that you own) since before January 1, 2006

And

- You paid the full amount of 2008 property taxes due on your home by June 1, 2009 and paid the 2009 property taxes by June 1, 2010

And

- Your total annual income was \$70,000 or less for 2008 and \$80,000 or less for 2009. NOTE: with very few exceptions, ALL INCOME received during the year must be taken into account to determine eligibility (including social security, pension income, etc.)

Deadline to file is June 1, 2010. Applications are available from the Tax Collector or online at www.state.nj.us/treasury/taxation. The hotline for more information (800) 882-6597.

Finally, we need editors who can look over the work of the writers and contributors to check for grammar, acronyms, phone numbers, etc. Editors meet twice before each issue comes out – so that's only eight times a year!
