Certification actions are developed by a local committee that will work through an ongoing process of discussion and research to identify and at times implement "actions" from an extensive list of possibilities. 

Memorial Day Parade Monday, May 30th

The 2011 Scotch Plains-Fanwood Memorial Day Parade will be held on Monday, May 30^{th.} The opening ceremonies will begin for Fanwood at 9 AM at Fanwood Memorial Library, followed at 9:45 AM at the Scotch Plains gazebo. The parade will then follow, beginning at Park Avenue and Front Street in Scotch Plains and ending in Fanwood.

Memorial Day pays tribute to American military personnel of all wars who made the ultimate sacrifice by giving their lives in the service of our country. This year's parade will commemorate "The 70th Anniversary of the Start of World War II." The parade and its committee also recognize 2011 as significant in four additional areas: the 150th Anniversary of the start of the Civil War; the 50th Anniversary of the start of the Vietnam War; the 20th Anniversary of the Gulf War; and the 10th Anniversary of the start of the war in Afghanistan.





Although this Fanwoodian is originally from Schenectady, New York, he has been a Fanwood resident for 24 years. Since his arrival, his contributions to our town are many:

- 20 years on the Planning Board (17 of those serving as Chairman);
- Still serving on the Clean Community Committee after 18 years (this Committee organizes our Earth Day celebrations);
- Organized Fanwood's first Holiday celebration in 1996 and served as Committee Chairman for three years;
- Served on the LaGrande Park Redevelopment Committee for three years;
- Served on the Mayor's Budget Advisory Committee for one year.

When he's not working hard for our town his avocation is photography, and over the years he has won 18 awards from such organizations as the National Wildlife Refuges of Rhode Island, the Wickford Rhode Island Open Juried Photo Show, the Union County NJ Juried Senior Art Contest, and the NJ State Juried Senior Art Contest. These awards ranged from "Best of Show" to "Honorable Mention." Other interests include tennis, skiing, fishing and hiking.

Before retiring, he worked for 35 years in marketing and sales. He is the father of two daughters and one son and the grandfather of four.

A Message From Mayor Colleen Mahr

Fanwood is looking beautiful this Spring! Flowers are blooming, the Fanwood Garden Club has spruced up the downtown flowerpots and the Department of Public Works is picking up winter debris, filling potholes, sweeping the streets and getting our parks ready for summer fun! Police bicycle patrols have recommenced, and I think you'll agree that the town is in very good condition, both aesthetically and business-wise.

The tough decisions and stringent budgeting of the last several years continue to serve us well. While other towns are challenged to stay within the new state mandated 2% budget cap, Fanwood was able to meet it. The cap, for those not familiar with it, means that towns are not allowed to raise the amount collected for taxation more than 2 percent over what they collected the previous year. Understanding how burdensome rising property taxes are for us all, we have worked diligently to maintain the same funding level since 2009. Although Fanwood controls only 20% of your overall property tax bill, we continue to do more with less as we weather these challenging financial times. This is why it is critical to continue to examine all the potential savings that might be gained through sharing services with neighboring communities.

On May 2nd the Borough Council and I met with Mayor Malool and the Scotch Plains Council to advance our Shared Service discussions. Our commitment is to seize every cost-saving measure that maintains or improves current service levels, but NEVER to skimp on safety or the quality of life that makes us proud to be Fanwoodians. While focusing on shared Police, Construction and Municipal Court services, Police Chief Trigo and I have committed to work closely when discussions turn to the Police Department. Safety is not for sale in this community. Bear in mind that Fanwood and Scotch Plains already have a substantial shared service in place. Representing 60% of your property tax bill, our regional school system has served all of us well. I encourage you to play an active role in this discussion by attending public meetings and always understanding that I am just a phone call or email away.

An unwelcome result of the early Spring rains was a flood in the Children's Department of the Library. The scope of the flood required the basement to be stripped, so we took advantage of the crisis by having air quality, mold and engineering studies done. There is a history of water in that facility and we are working with engineers on how to best proceed. Fortunately, the air quality testing showed good results. Working with the Library Board of Trustees, we will re-open the Children's Department as soon as possible. I thank Director Dan Weiss for all his hard work and appreciate the professionalism of his staff in adjusting to this major inconvenience. And I must thank the Scotch Plains Library as well for welcoming the high volume of Fanwood residents who have been walking through their doors.

It was heartening to see three Fanwoodians run for the open School Board seat held by Rob O'Conner. Rob has served for nine years with dedication, professionalism and enthusiasm. I've enjoyed working with him on Board matters as well as coteaching the Brunner after-school woodworking classes. To Maggie Savoca and Michael Lewis, I applaud your interest and dedication in running for public office. It is not an easy task and I am glad you both stepped up to the challenge. To Jeanne Cleary, congratulations on your successful run. I know you will serve us well and I look forward to working with you and Amy Winkler on the many issues that concern Fanwood.

Union County Bureau of Mosquito Control

Is there any way that I can control mosquitoes from breeding around my home?

Any open, outdoor container that retains water can breed mosquitoes. Clogged roof gutters, old wheel-less tires, unmaintained swimming pools and flower pots all will collect organic material such as old leaves. These are attractive sites for breeding and tend to take a very long time to dry out. Natural depressions in your yard can also hold stagnant water. Regrade these areas to eliminate the puddles. Keep children's toys indoors or make sure to dump out any water that they accumulate. Bird baths should have the water changed at least twice a week. Pet water bowls and flower pot saucers should be monitored as well. Have roof gutters checked and cleaned at the beginning of spring and at mid-summer. Make sure window and door screens are properly fitted and repaired. Many repellants are available to provide relief from mosquitoes and other insects/pests. Always follow the instructions on the labels, and check with your family physician before applying any repellant to an infant or young child.

Fanwood Library Children's Department Update

Due to the most recent incident of flooding in the Children's Department, the lower level of the Fanwood Memorial Library has been closed to the public since early March. This is the third time in five years that water has damaged the basement level.

To help ensure the health and safety of library users and staff, the Board of Trustees has closed the Children's Department while remediation and repairs can be addressed. Library services and activities for adults and children will continue on the main level while decisions are made as to the best way forward to insure the best quality library service.

16th Annual Fanny Wood Day Sunday, October 2nd



Lawn Mowers: How to Keep Our Children Safe

To make sure that only the grass gets cut, here are some safety tips to help protect our children during this busy mowing season:



- Keep children out of the yard. Lawn mower blades can whirl around at 100 to 200 miles per hour. They can pick up objects and toss them out at high speeds.
- Use a lawn mower that stops automatically when you release the handle.
- Never let children play on the lawn mower. Don't allow children age 12 or younger to operate a walking lawn mower. Keep kids age 14 or younger off riding mowers.
- Mow forward, if you mow backward, you may not notice a child approaching from behind.
- When turning off the mower, wait for the blades to stop turning.
- If you use a gas-powered mower, avoid possible toxic ingestion by closing gas cans and storing them out of the reach of children.
