After a long and active summer, the lower level of the library should be reopened by mid-September. The Children's Department will be completely renovated with the combined support of the Borough, the Board of Trustees, and the Friends of the Fanwood Memorial Library. The water, mold, and asbestos issues will have been remediated. In addition, there will be new, more efficient lighting and HVAC systems as well as all new shelving, furniture, and a great new layout. We are looking forward to the reopening

so that we can serve everyone more effectively.

Our mascot guinea pigs are still be with us. Please make sure to come by to see our great new space and say "hi" to Brownie and Butterscotch!

Please take advantage of the Museum Pass Program, which allows patrons to borrow museum passes at no charge or for a highly discounted rate. The 16th annual Fanny Wood Day will be held on Sunday, October 2nd starting at 11:00 AM. and ending at 5:00 PM. Once again this annual street fair and community event will be held along the length of Martine

and South Avenues in downtown Fanwood.

The festivities include plenty of food and craft vendors, as well as live musical entertainment provided by the School of Rock and a featured performance by the Scotch Plains – Fanwood High School Cabaret Troupe. The special children's area will again feature an array of fun things for kids to do at an all day rate of \$10/ person. Included are Bounce 'n Slide, Trackless Train, Moonwalk, Jurassic Survivor and Mutiny on the Bounty. Balloon clowns, live entertainment, and loads of contests will all be a part of the day's fun.

The deadline for submitting photos is September 23rd so don't delay. We will again feature two established contests, the annual Ice Cream Eating contest sponsored by Double Dipper and the

From the Desk of Chief Trigo

With school opening shortly, the Fanwood Police would like to offer some pedestrian safety tips to children and adults.

Parents should be aware that even the most cautious children can forget the rules of safety when they're caught up in the excitement of a new school year. Going over a few of the most important back-to-school safety tips with your children will help ensure their safety.

Please remind children of the basics of crossing the street: look to the right, then to the left and then to the right again, and only cross when there are no cars approaching from either direction. If children are crossing at an intersection, it is important that they watch for cars making right turns. Children should always walk with at least one other child and avoid such dangers as yards with unsecured dogs or holes in the sidewalk.

Crossing the street safely is also important for children who ride bicycles to school. Explain to your children that they must pay special attention to their surroundings and ride their bikes as far as possible to the right side of the road to avoid contact with cars. Make sure your children stop when approaching a driveway to avoid a possible collision with a vehicle. Explain that it might not be easy for someone backing out of a driveway to see a child on a bicycle. Helmets should always be worn to prevent head injuries that can occur if your child is thrown from the bicycle.

I encourage everyone to visit the police department's website at www.fanwoodpolice.org to view our safety tips for pedestrians and drivers.

The purpose of National Night Out is to create a partnership between the police and the community. Alternative Schools

Students entering 8th grade at Terrill Middle School and



Park Middle School have the option of attending Scotch Plains-Fanwood High School or applying to one of the county high schools located at 1776 Raritan Road

in Scotch Plains. The Schools of UCVTS (Union County Vocational-Technical Schools) have a rigorous application process and are open to residents of each of Union County's 21 municipalities, including Fanwood and Scotch Plains. Applications must include transcripts from Grade 7, as well as the first marking period of Grade 8, standardized test scores and completion of an entrance exam.

The five high schools are:

- Magnet High School
- Academy For Information Technology (AIT)

- Academy for Allied Health
- Union County Tech
- Academy For Performing Arts

Admission to The Academy For Performing Arts will also require auditions.

Information sessions, including tours of the schools, will take place on:

- Saturday, September 24th at 9 AM
- Thursday, October 6th at 6:30 PM
- Saturday, October 22nd at 9 AM
- Tuesday November 22nd at 6:30 AM
- Saturday, December 3rd at 9 AM

A Message From Mayor Colleen Mahr



Labor Day is upon us and I'm happy to be leaving behind the record-breaking heat of Summer 2011! As the children return to school I want to send my good wishes for a productive and enjoyable school year. Drivers, let's all be a little more careful on the road as we adjust to sharing the streets

with youngsters trekking to and from school.

Fanwood was pretty quiet over the summer, but there was plenty going on! Contractors have completed the Belvidere Avenue paving, sidewalk and curb job. The Watson Road reconstruction project should be complete by the time you read this. These road reconstruction jobs are funded through state grants, and we are very grateful for these funds that offset the costs to our residents. Borough engineers classify the streets most in need for each new round of grants, so please advise me if you believe your block should be on that list.

Fanwood's Shared Services Committee, comprised of Councilman Russ Huegel, Administrator Eleanor McGovern and myself have conducted several Shared Services meetings with Scotch Plains throughout the summer. Our primary focus is to coordinate our Police and Court services. Both Fanwood Police Chief Trigo & Scotch Plains Police Chief Mahoney are active participants who are supportive of the possibilities. I am very serious about examining a multitude of issues in order to make this happen, including the ultimate structure, governance, council oversight and, of course, cost. Rest assured, I do NOT have a predetermined outcome. Until we know that any consolidated department will be beneficial to Fanwoodians, no decision can be made. As far as I am concerned, safety is paramount. In light of the 2% budget cap, everything must be on the table for discussion. No final decisions will be made without public input.

Thanks to a grant from the County of Union and the willingness of Home Depot to partner with the Fanwood Recycling Center the Recycling Center is now accepting fluorescent light bulbs. This is really a wonderful development. Fluorescent bulbs contain mercury and should be recycled. I am very pleased that Fanwood is in the vanguard of this public/private partnership to protect our environment.

By October 1st we expect to have the Children's Library restored to full operation. Given the severity of the spring flood and the general dampness of the room we've stripped it bare, passed environmental testing, removed all old asbestos flooring. We are starting with a clean slate. We've also done drainage work inside and out to prevent further flooding. One can never

News from the Fanwood Recycling Center

Mayor Colleen Mahr and the Fanwood Recycling Association are pleased to announce a new recycling initiative. The Recycling Center will soon be accepting old light bulbs (i.e. fluorescent, CFL's, tube lighting). Thanks to a \$3,000 recycling grant from the County of Union, as well as a donation from Home Depot, the Association is constructing a safe storage facility and appropriate signage. Initially, this new program will be open to Fanwood residents only. Once the average number of light bulbs received is determined, the Center will expand the service to Scotch Plains and Westfield residents. Mayor Mahr said "For the Association now to be able to recycle fluorescent light bulbs is a boon. The old bulbs contain mercury; very harmful to the environment. This is a good thing for Fanwood."

As a reminder, the Recycling Center accepts items other than the usual glass, plastics, cardboard and paper. This include heavy metals (refrigerators, humidifiers, washers, dryers, AC's, lawn mowers), electronics (computers, printers, TV's, phones) and heavy rigid plastics (patio chairs/tables, outside toys, flower pots, old garbage cans). The Recycling Center suggests that a monetary donation be made when dropping off these types of items. The funds are needed to defray the costs involved in hauling everything to a central dump site.



Apples are available from mid-July through August and pumpkins are available during the fall season. Melick's Town Farm also offers hayrides at both locations.
