Legislation: No Knock List

Ordinance 11-10-R was recently adopted by the Borough Council. It provides a "No Knock List" for residents who do not wish licensed persons (peddlers, solicitors or transient merchants) to seek contact with anyone in their home. Residents will be required to notify the Municipal Clerk and complete a form authorizing the Clerk to add their name to the "No Knock List". When this is done the resident can post a "No Knock" sign at the front entrance to his or her home to warn solicitors. The registration will last for five years.

This list will be given to all peddlers, solicitors and transient merchants when they apply for a permit to solicit in the Borough.

A Message From Mayor Colleen Mahr

What a fall we've had! School began in the aftermath of Hurricane Irene and that was followed up by heavy rains and a record snow fall right before Halloween. Through it all, the true strength of Fanwood was revealed in neighbor helping neighbor, fire and rescue

volunteers putting in countless hours to keep us safe and the Police and Public Works employees going above and beyond to be responsive and helpful to so many of us who were in need.

Power outages were the most disturbing element of both events and although Chief Trigo and I were in constant contact with PSE&G, there was little we could do beyond keeping PSEG informed of outages and keeping residents informed of all developments. We relied heavily on the Union County First Alert system and the newly revamped Borough website to keep in touch with you, so please, if you haven't signed up for either one or both, go to www.ucfirstalert.com and www.fanwoodnj.org to get yourself on the distribution lists. They have proven to be effective communication tools.

I want to personally thank you all for the resounding support in the recent general election. It was a welcome confirmation that you believe we are on the right track in aggressively focusing on downtown redevelopment and investigating all the shared services opportunities that work for Fanwood. During my next term I will focus on making sure Fanwood remains the wonderful community that we all call home. Having Russell Huegel and Kevin Boris on the Council will maintain the same successful balance we've enjoyed in the recent past.

The election wasn't the only confirmation that we are on the right track. Fanwood's downtown redevelopment efforts are being featured in "The Redevelopment Handbook, A Guide to Rebuilding New Jersey Communities," compiled by the New Jersey Department of Community Affairs. Fanwood's story will feature the town's repudiation of the powers of "eminent domain" in favor of working with property owners, merchants and the community. It is quite an honor to be included as an example of how to build a vibrant downtown where people are living, working and spending time.

Other recent honors bestowed on Fanwood include an Honorable Mention from the NJ League of Municipalities for "Innovation in Governance" contest. We were recognized for reinventing how we handle small infrastructure projects in

Recycling of Fluorescent Bulbs



Fluorescent light bulbs are now being recycled by our Fanwood-Scotch Plains Recycling Association on North Avenue. Al Ebersole, Site Manager, explains that while fluorescent light bulbs are more energy efficient than standard incandescent light bulbs, they contain mercury and therefore should not be thrown into the regular trash. Our Recycling Association provides a means to immediately dispose of any used bulbs, rather than storing them for a designated Hazardous Waste Recycling Day normally held by the County. The Center is open on Wednesdays and Saturdays from 9 AM to 1 PM.

Bus Transportation for Seniors



If you are 55 years of age or older, are self-reliant or accompanied by an aide, you are eligible for free bus service. Funded by a grant from Union County, the program is offered to residents of the Borough of Fanwood to do your food shopping or go to doctors' appointments. Simply go to www.fanwoodnj.org, and fill out the form provided under "Bus Services." Then call (908) 322-5151 to make a reservation. This service is operated by the Township of Scotch Plains. Bus transportation to doctors' appointments is also available through Union County Paratransit. For an appointment call 908-241-8300.

town. Fanwood was the first in the state to partner with out-of-work union laborers and hire them on small construction projects where the Borough in effect acted as the General Contractor. In the past the borough would publicly bid out jobs like this, but by rethinking how we provide a service without compromising quality, we saved tens of thousands of tax dollars by keeping the project in house. This relationship then allowed us to do bigger jobs than our streamlined DPW staff could handle. We were also acknowledged by the Rutgers Center for Government Services with a Special Recognition in the "Municipal Public Information Contest". Here we were applauded for our newly constructed website, along with the many ways we communicate with our residents.

Besides handling our two weather emergencies, Borough staff has been busy. We have recently approved contracts for the reconstruction of Herbert Avenue, La Grande Park and assorted curbing and sidewalks in need of replacement throughout the borough. We will also be upgrading the lighting in the Borough Hall parking lot and replacing the overhead door at the firehouse. Renovation work will also begin at the historic train station and the Pat Kuran Cultural Arts Center compliments of a Union County Historical Preservation grant. Fanwood was also a recipient of \$50,000 from the Board of Chosen Freeholders, the Kids Recreational Trust fund grant. Look for work to take place in the parks and these locations over the next year. One of the most exciting additions this





Time to Renew Pet Licenses



All dogs and cats in Fanwood, seven months or older, are required to be licensed annually. The license fees are \$10 per dog or

cat who are spayed/neutered; \$15 for those who are not spayed/neutered. The deadline for obtaining the license is January 31st, 2012 or a late fee will be imposed. If you no longer own a dog or cat, please inform the Borough officials by calling (908) 322-8236.

Licenses may be obtained in person at the office of the Municipal Clerk, Fanwood Borough Hall, 75 N. Martine Avenue. The office is open Monday-Friday from 8 AM-4 PM and on Thursday evenings from 5 PM-8 PM. Licenses can also be obtained by mailing the proper fee, current rabies vaccination certificate and/or prior year's license with a self-addressed stamped envelope to Borough Hall.

LaGrande Park Improvements

Before the end of the year, LaGrande Park will be undergoing some major changes... for the better! The most noticeable improvement will be the installation of a 30-foot by 44-foot wooden-arched, open-air pavilion, including tables and benches, among the trees along the path near the rink area. The pavilion will offer residents the opportunity for family picnics, our town a focus for town-wide events and our schools a resource for field trips. Also, Fanwood Recreation's Summer Park Program will be able to use the pavilion for arts and crafts activities, and more. Nearby, a new basketball court will replace the current one, which, as anyone who has played there recently knows, is in poor condition. The new court will feature two new backboards and supports, a bi-colored painted playing surface, and two new benches.

The circular rink area will be fully resurfaced. Long-time residents remember when ice skaters were able to circle the rink on cold winter days. In recent years,

the rink's surface developed cracks, preventing it from holding water long enough to freeze. The new surface should remedy that, allowing ice skaters to return to



LaGrande Park once the temperature falls below freezing. Lastly, a large area in front of the LaGrande Park recreation building will also be resurfaced. The loss of a few large trees in recent years has left this area pockmarked with cutouts in the asphalt. The resurfacing will smooth out this area, making it safer to walk across. And by the Spring, painted children's games such as hopscotch and four square will be imprinted on parts of the new surface. Combined with the addition of a ring of planters in front of the building, this area should become an attractive

centerpiece for the entire park.

Park visitors may have already noticed the recent addition of an electronic scoreboard, standing off to the side of the baseball fields. Donated by the Fanwood Youth Organization Baseball (FYO), the scoreboard will be available to all leagues using the park. Non-FYO leagues will need to contact FYO to arrange for its usage.
