
Earth Day

Are You Better Prepared For The Next Disaster?

In 2011, New Jersey experienced spring flooding, an

earthquake, Hurricane Irene and an October nor'easter. Are you ready for what 2012 might bring? The Fanwood Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) reminds you that now is the best time to "Get a Kit, Make a Plan, and Be Informed" — three things you can do to help yourself and

your family be better prepared for any kind of disaster. For the Kit part, consider putting together a box of items in case you can't leave your home for several days. This box should include — non-perishable food, bottled water and enough medications to support your family's needs and don't forget your pet's needs! Also consider what you would need to take with you if you need to evacuate your home – that's a "Go Bag." Check all of these kits at

least twice a year (maybe the same time you change the

clocks). For the Plan, consider where your family would go if you had to leave your home (maybe a neighbor's house or friend's home in the area), if you had to leave Union County (place at the shore or in PA), and finally where would you go if you had to evacuate New Jersey. Share this plan

with all of your family members so they all know where to go — especially if they can't communicate with each other during a disaster. Finally, the Be Informed part includes signing up for online alerts, having a weather radio at home and other ways you can learn about disaster preparedness. A Message From Mayor Colleen Mahr

Goodness knows how we managed it but at the time of this writing, winter has passed us by! Though I do love the look of a newly fallen snow and the fun of doling out hot chocolate to my three snow fort warriors, this year I did not miss it. After the hurricane and ice storm of Fall 2011 I am glad that we weren't called into action on that scale again. Hopefully when you read this we won't be up to our chins in a late blizzard, but watching our crocus peep through to welcome spring!

Of course from a fiscal standpoint, an easy winter spells savings on the salting, plowing and overtime that come with winter storms. That's a real boon given the extra expenses

incurred during the foul fall weather. Another upside of the weather is that we were able to move ahead with some improvements at La Grande Park, upgrading the basketball court and installing a sun shelter to serve the summer recreation program and the entire community. Work is nearly complete and I think you will agree that it is an appealing design and will see a lot of activity!

The Borough has been hard at work on the 2012 municipal budget which will be introduced at the March 20th Council Meeting. The proposed budget will reflect a \$7.67 increase over 2011 for an average homeowner. This represents 1/3rd of 1% increase, well under the mandated 2% tax levy cap.

The Borough's anticipated spending for the year is less than for 2011, and shows our commitment to living within our means and being responsible stewards of your hard earned tax dollars. The public hearing and adoption of the budget will be scheduled for a hearing in April, I encourage you visit our website for more information.

Part of our overall budget planning is an in-depth study of a joint Fanwood/Scotch Plains Police Department. Talks between both governing bodies are underway and despite what you may have read in the press, our discussions have been productive and ongoing. I remain focused on leading the discussion on creating a joint police department. For my part, there will be no change unless it results in improved service to borough residents at a reduced cost. Once I have a more complete financial picture my goal is to call a community meeting to properly share information and answer questions from the public. Until that time, no judgment can be made as to whether or not this is the right move for Fanwood.

You may also have read of a push to create a study committee to develop a plan for consolidation of the Borough of Fanwood with the Township of Scotch Plains. Although it provides some juicy fodder for the press, the timing is not appropriate to conduct yet a further study of our two towns. In December 2009 we received a grant to fund an extensive examination of the two town's operations. The resulting report, "Full Shared Services Study for the Township of Scotch Plains and Borough of Fanwood" recommends AGAINST a merger, a point of view I share. You can find the entire report on www.fanwoodnj.org.

And finally, I am delighted to congratulate Fanwood Administrator/Clerk Eleanor McGovern for being named a "Union County Woman of Excellence." You all know Eleanor; she has been a constant presence at Borough Hall for 27 years. Eleanor has coordinated and attended over 600 meetings of the Mayor & Council, oversees all elections and manages all Borough Departments. A Fanwood resident and dedicated employee, Eleanor has worked tirelessly to help make Fanwood the wonderful town we know it to be. I hope you will join me in a sincere "Thank You" to Eleanor for her many years of dedication to our community. Thank you Eleanor!



Recycling Center Update

Al Ebersole, Manager of the Recycling Center reports that the Center earned \$115,000 in 2011. These monies were

distributed among 25 local civic organization.

He also reminds us that if you are a disabled senior, you can call Doreen at the Department of Public Works (908) 322-7404, who will schedule you for pick up of

your recyclable items curbside at your request. These should be sorted according to guidelines established by the Recycling Center.

Over 2,000 fluorescent bulbs have been recycled through Home Depot since the program began in August, 2011. Ordinary incandescent bulbs can be thrown in the garbage.




